## **Hancock Center 2018 Programs and Services**

### **PROGRAMS AT HANCOCK CENTER**

- Individual dance/movement therapy (DMT) sessions for adults, children and families
- Movement and socialization group for adults with developmental differences
- Parenting through movement group for toddlers and families

### **PROGRAMS IN THE COMMUNITY**

- In-School Violence Prevention & Pro-Social Skills Training program for children and teachers in classrooms of six Madison elementary schools
- In-School therapy sessions for groups of children in three Madison elementary schools
- Creative movement activities at Fitchburg Library summer classes
- Movement and socialization for older adults in memory care at Coventry Village
- Creative movement & social and physical skills building for preschoolers at PreSchool of the Arts
- Embodied Recovery, dance/movement therapy group for adults in recovery from addiction at Hope Haven
- DMT-based trainings and in-services: for Dane County social workers and for Verona area teens with special needs
- Hancock therapists collaborated in community projects, events, and professional exchanges and partnered with family members, team case workers and other service organizations in support of our client population.
