POSITION SUMMARY

Experienced Licensed Professional Counselor, Licensed Clinical Social Worker or Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist with a Master's degree will provide therapy services to children and/or adults who have a variety of social/emotional needs and DSM-V diagnoses, including PTSD. HC is seeking applicants who have training and expertise integrating creative arts, dance/movement therapy or somatic, body centered approaches into their therapy practice. These services occur both on-site at HC and in the local community. This position entails collaboration with client teams, HC staff and volunteers, and professional representation of HC. The position is 15-19 hours per week. There is potential to increase hours based on the needs of HC.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Current LPC, LCSW, or LMFT credential and a Master's degree are required.
- A strong clinical background with a minimum of 2 years post-graduate experience providing therapy is necessary.
- Training and experience in trauma therapy (emotional/physical/sexual abuse) is necessary.
- Ability to work a combination of daytime and evening hours is necessary.
- Ability to transport independently to off-site facilities is necessary.
- Strong communication skills, including verbal and written, is necessary.
- Experience or commitment to developing and maintaining relationships with community based services is desirable.
- Familiarity and experience working with people with intellectual differences and neuro-developmental issues is preferred.
- Proficiency in speaking and/or writing in Spanish is advantageous.
