Position Summary

Experienced Board Certified-Dance/Movement Therapist (BC-DMT) with a Master's degree will provide individual and group dance/movement therapy services to children and/or adults who have a variety of social/emotional needs and DSM-V diagnoses, including PTSD. These services occur both on-site at Hancock Center and in the local community. Join a highly collaborative organization. The positions start at 20 hours per week with benefits, with potential to increase hours based on needs. (A combined position working with both children and adults could be 32-40 hours per week.)

- Current BC-DMT credential and a Master's degree
- Ability to work a combination of day, evening and possibly some weekend hours
- Ability to transport independently to off-site facilities
- Additional LPC, LCSW, or MSW credential preferred
- Able to secure State of Wisconsin Dance Therapist registration with license to practice psychotherapy (DTRL)
- Commitment to adhering to the ADTA Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice
- Able to work in the U.S. without requiring sponsorship

Experience/Skills

- Training and experience in trauma therapy (emotional/physical/sexual abuse)
- Demonstrated knowledge of working with historically marginalized individuals and communities
- Strong communication skills, including verbal and written
- Experience or commitment to developing and maintaining relationships with community-based services
- Prefer a strong clinical background with 2 years post-graduate experience as a D/MT
- Prefer experience working with people with intellectual differences and neuro-developmental issues
- Proficiency in speaking and/or writing in Spanish is advantageous

Additional Details

Benefits include regular clinical supervision by an experienced BC-DMT; paid vacation, sick and holiday time; short- and long-term disability and life insurance; and eligibility for bonuses. Hancock Center requires employees to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19, recognizing exceptions for religious or medical reasons.
